3. How is the coming of the Holy Spirit to the believers at Pentecost the fulfillment of God’s overarching plan? (Lev. 26:11–12; Zech. 2:10–11)
4. When do all Christians receive the indwelling Holy Spirit? (Acts 2:38; 2 Cor. 1:21–22; Eph. 1:13–14)
5. To what four things does this new community devote itself? (v. 42)
6. Fellowship, from the Greek word “koinonia,” means “common.”
 - a. What have the believers received in common that unites them? (Acts 2:36–38)
 - b. What is the practical outworking of this unity? (vv. 44–47)
 - c. What model of Christian fellowship have the apostles learned first-hand that they now pass along to the new believers? (Jn. 13:1, 12–17)
